## March 28<sup>th</sup>. "LIVE MEETING" Ruth Rivkin: Polar Bears in the Canadian Arctic

# **Presentation:**

The Arctic is warming at an unprecedented rate, threatening the persistence of polar bears. I study the genetic basis of evolution in polar bears to understand their capacity for survival and adaptation to climate warming. I use cutting-edge research methods to guide conservation and management strategies that can promote polar bear survival.

# Bio:

I am a Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the University of Manitoba, working jointly with Polar Bears International, Environment and Climate Change Canada, and the San Diego Zoo Wildlife Alliance. I completed my PhD in the Department of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology at the University of Toronto in 2021 where I studied the role that cities play in shaping biodiversity. Originally from Newfoundland, I now live in Guelph, where I enjoy walking my dogs in Preservation Park and baking sourdough bread.
