Susan Glasauer: The Importance of Wetlands and Bill 23

Bio:

Dr. Susan Glasauer is a faculty member in the School of Environmental Sciences at the University of Guelph, and the president for the Canadian chapter of the Society for Wetland Scientists. She completed an undergraduate degree in Plant and Soil Biology and a Masters in Soil Chemistry at the University of California at Berkeley, and a doctoral degree at the Technical University of Munich in Germany. Following several years as an environmental consultant, with wetland restoration projects in the Niger Delta, she joined Dr. Terry Beveridge at the University of Guelph as a post-doctoral researcher before accepting a faculty position in Land Resource Science in 2003. Her research is focused on the interactions between microbes, metals, and elements of concern in Canada such as arsenic and uranium. Wetlands are central to her research because they are among the most chemically and biologically diverse environments on Earth. The activity of wetland microbes in particular can be manipulated to remove elements of concern from wastewater, or to liberate nutrient elements from rocks that are essential to both microbes and to higher organisms such as plants. She will discuss her research and the future of wetlands in a changing climate world.
